This superb quality dish is in lead crystal and has been hand-blown and hand-cut. Featuring a turnover rim and hollow teardrop air bubble step. Resting on a pretty scalloped edge star-cut base.

Designed to capture and reflect the candlelight in a dazzling display, these pedestal dishes were often filled with fruit and sweetmeats.

Ireland's glass industry took off in the 18th Century, and the best glassmakers in England and Ireland (then part of Great Britain) created exquisite glassware known as Anglo-Irish glass.
